
The Macaquekaze



During World War II, the Imperial Japanese Military Command ordered nearly 4,000 kamikaze pilots to make suicide crash attacks on Allied ships. But many of the pilots balked at the directive, pooh-poohing the ancient Nipponese tradition of "death instead of defeat." So the Emperor himself donated more than eight hundred of his personal trained macaques to *Gen'in*, or, The Cause.
