In On the Steppes Steps



"In the Steppes of Central Asia" is a popular tone poem by Russian composer Alexander Borodin. At the tune's premiere, a critic wrote that the music realistically depicted peasants steppe-dancing in the Caucasus outback. However, a later scholar unearthed a photograph of Borodin and his mistress, Inge, that was captioned in the composer's shaky hand, "On the steps of the Central Asian Asylum," fueling speculation that the title's initial translation from B средней Азии was in error.
