Acme Turbo Bath



The world's first hot tub was the Acme Turbo Bath, a product of Dinklaker Aviation Research and Development. True, it lacked amenities common in today's units, such as an on-off switch or a stopper to help keep the water in the tub, however it more than compensated for those minor deficiencies with its powerful water jets. Thanks to state-of-the-art jet propulsion technology, the exhaust plume of the Turbo Bath's blower regularly reached 150 newtons. That's enough force to propel a 150-pound human 150 feet (assuming no gravitational anomalies) – which happened to more than a dozen surprised Turbobathers before the unit was discontinued ... thanks to the bathers' surprise ultimately turning to litigious-mindedness.
